<u>DISTINGUISHING FEATURES OF THE CLASS:</u> This is an important entry level professional legal position involving the responsibility of representing indigent clients in Otsego County Family Court as assigned by the Public Defender. Work involves representing indigent clients through every stage of proceedings, working collaboratively with members of the Public Defense Team.
